**JOURNAL CITES IN THE
WHITEPAGES**

Rule 16

JOURNAL CITE FONT

Author name(s): ordinary font

Article title: italicized

Journal name: small caps

NOTE: This is different from the Bluepages, where Small Caps are not used.

AUTHOR

In full cites, you should use the author's full name.
(Rule 16.2) For more information on authors, see Rule
15.1.

In short cites, you will use the author's last name with
a cross-reference. (Rule 16.9)

ARTICLE TITLE

The title of the article should be written as it is on the cover page in italicized, ordinary font.

JOURNAL INFORMATION

The journal information in the cite is generally “[volume] J. TITLE [starting page number] (year).”

You can add a pincite after the starting page number, preceded by a comma.

JOURNAL ABBREVIATIONS

The name of the journal should be abbreviated according to T6, T10, and T13.

FULL CITE

This is how a full cite would look:

Melanie C. Kalmanson, *Bluebook Wednesday*, 67
LINKEDIN 1, 7 (2024).
